Early interests of mine were in art and design yet I trained in the fine craft tradition of textiles and am drawn to fine materials and working with my hands. Many years were spent in the design and production of fabrics, clothing and rugs. The use of horsehair came about when dating then marrying a former horse trainer and rodeo rider in 1999, providing the opportunity to move away from production work.

Coiling and natural dyeing have been the primary techniques I have used with horsehair. In the last few years my work has included multiple techniques of plying, plaiting, twining, and knotless and knotted netting in addition to coiling and natural dyeing. Spending time closely looking at and observing the world around me serves as my inspiration. New pieces build on previous work in a constant dance of moving forward and pulling from my personal past to create unusual, inventive sculptural forms.

My work is exhibited internationally in juried and invitational shows and is collected privately. Since 2016, I have been serving on the board of the National Basketry Organization, assisting with bringing our biennial conferences to fruition.
